
sheltered workshop. He also learnt to travel independently by bus, first from Goregaon to Powai and then up to Airoli!!

SAEE SAWANT

Meet the Sawant family, whose unwavering love and resilience have turned challenges into triumphs. Aditi and Dinesh, both with physical disabilities, approached parenthood with determination. Their daughter, Saee, was diagnosed with intellectual disability, but their family story is one of strength and unity. She joined MBA Foundation from May 2023.

Despite physical limitations, Aditi and Dinesh created an environment where Saee could thrive.

They embraced adaptive parenting techniques, fostering Saee's independence while instilling a sense of support and understanding. The family became a tight-knit team, navigating daily tasks with creativity and collaboration.

Recognizing Saee's potential, the Sawants actively sought inclusive opportunities. MBA Foundation tailored support, enabling her to participate fully in therapy, skill development and extracurricular activities. Her achievements became a source of pride for the entire family. MBA Foundation under it's wings of **Sanyukta Tailoring Project**, trained Aditi

(Saee's mother) to use sewing machine and tailoring skills. She is now employed under Sanyukta. Saee's father, Dinesh has been provided with a stall for disabled from municipal cooperation and he runs a small shop for livelihood.

Today, the Sawant family stands as a beacon of resilience, proving that a family's strength lies not in perfection but in embracing each other's differences. Their success story is a testament to love, adaptability, and the transformative power of unity in the face of adversity.



YASH KAWALE

At the tender age of one, Yash faced an epileptic attack. He was hospitalized and was under medication. He was diagnosed with Global Development Disability. He was under medication for 3 years at Bai Jerabai Wadia Hospital. After 3 years the Doctor suggested that he should get enrolled in a Special School. Yash faced the challenges of severe intellectual disability. His world was silent, for he couldn't speak, and his tiny legs were unable to carry him on adventures like other children.

Yash's parents and grandparents, determined to unlock the doors to his potential, embarked on a journey of exploration and hope. One day, fate took an unexpected turn when Yash's parent met a doctor at Wadia Hospital and he introduced Yash to the world of MBA—Movement, Breath, and Awareness.

In the serene environment of MBA Foundation, Yash began his journey from January 2023. Through carefully designed movements, rhythmic breathing exercises, and heightened awareness activities, Yash's world started to transform. Though progress was gradual, it was steady and filled with hope.

With each passing day, Yash's muscles grew stronger, and a spark of understanding gleamed in his eyes. The once-silent boy began to express himself through gestures and sounds, breaking the barriers of speech. His laughter echoed in the therapy room, a melody of triumph over adversity.

As the year unfolded, Yash achieved a remarkable milestone—he took his first steps, defying the limitations that once confined him. His parent stood in awe, witnessing the incredible transformation of his son from a boy who couldn't walk to a determined explorer taking on the world one step at a time. Yash's journey became an inspiration, not just for his family, but for the entire community. The power of love, perseverance, and innovative therapies had unlocked his hidden potential, proving that every child, regardless of their challenges, deserved a chance to shine.



NEELAM MITHAILAL CHAUHAN

Neelam, with her indomitable spirit, overcame her mild mental retardation and mild cerebral palsy. She was determined to prove that her disabilities were not limitations but merely stepping stones towards her dreams. Neelam was born through normal delivery at home. Her birth weight was very low (1.5 kg).

All her milestones got delayed. Her lower limbs had severe deformity. Thus, she was made to stay at home and no formal education was given. Neelam's father works as a daily labourer and mother works as domestic help.

Neelam's case was identified during a home visit by authorities of Sangharsh Nagar community centre. With a lot of counselling sessions conducted for the parents, they were finally convinced to bring Neelam for therapy from 10th of July 2023. A special education program at MBA Foundation in Sangharsh Nagar community centre was formulated, that provided the support she needed.

With the unwavering support of her dedicated therapists and special educator at Sangharsh Nagar, Neelam embarked on a path of growth and development. Through consistent effort and hard work, Neelam made significant strides in her fine motor and gross motor skills. Her therapists provided tailored interventions, focusing on activities to enhance her coordination and strength. With each passing day, Neelam showed remarkable improvement in her ability to control her movements and engage in various physical activities.

Not only did Neelam thrive in functional academics, but she also discovered her passion for dance and singing. At the same time, Neelam continued to receive therapy and interventions tailored to her needs. With the guidance of skilled healthcare professionals, she made remarkable progress in improving her physical abilities and speech. With her newfound confidence, she actively participated in group dance. Neelam's incredible journey of triumph didn't go unnoticed. She became a beacon of hope for others facing similar challenges.

All stories are not successes; we have our challenges too. But our rehab team tries out various methods of overcoming these challenges. With total support and enthusiasm of parents, we are able to cross over most of the challenges. Acceptance of their limitations and working around them is also a great method to mend them.

Such days of success are celebrated at our centre, which largely motivate the entire team of rehab, who work tirelessly with various alternatives to find success. It becomes all the more easy, when parents too join hands in this endeavour.

Awareness Programs

3rd December 2022 organised Inclusive Fun Fair Mela in our centre. NGOS participated by putting up different stalls. The entertainment program by the trainees and outside professional singers. Mr Madan Dodeja MD, Vashi Electrical & Ms Alka Kelekar - Ex Deputy Mayor of Mumbai were the chief guest.

10th December 2022 a Seminar on Developing Inclusive society – 4 eminent speakers from different fields were the speakers and 8 panelist who shared their experienced working in mainstream and the challenges they faced.

THE NEW INITIATIVES

Mann Foundation: In our search for better training opportunities, especially for people with mild intellectual disability, we added one more employment-oriented training program in association with Mann Foundation (Centre for individuals with special needs). This is a vocational skill development training in the areas of hospitality, retail marketing, food and beverage (kitchen assistance) management, etc.





Sanyukta: Training in Tailoring for underprivileged Parents & Sheltered work unit girl trainees, was initiated by Mrs. Meenal Mandlik, Director of Self Esteem Foundation for Disabled on 18th January 2023. It is specifically designed to empower young mothers of differently-abled children and young adults with disabilities. The core objective of this inclusive initiative is to create an environment for enabling the mothers and

differently-abled young girls to earn a decent income and also enhance their skills. The basic training program is for three months. The first batch of 12 ladies was supported by Aurion Pro Solutions Ltd and the second batch of 13 ladies was supported by The Society of Dyers and Colourists India and Archroma.

Empowering Abilities Through Physical Activity: Introduced a new Sports Initiative for Trainees. In a world that is increasingly recognizing the importance of inclusivity, this new sports initiative stands as a beacon of empowerment for individuals with disabilities. Through thoughtful design, inclusive training, and a strong sense of community involvement, the program is not just



introducing a new physical activity but is creating a platform for individuals to thrive, irrespective of their abilities. As the initiative continues to evolve, it serves as a model for how sports can be a catalyst for positive change, breaking down barriers and empowering individuals to reach new heights. The professional Sports instructor has been involved in the training.

The ultimate aim is to guide and empower those youngsters who can enrol for Special Olympics and others who can to be self-sustaining and contributing citizens of this country rather than dependents.

Legal Guardianship, under Section 14 of the National Trust Act, 1999 This Act is especially applicable for persons with autism, Intellectual Disability, Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disability, who need support in managing their financials and personal care.

Application for Legal Guardianship can be made by a person who is above 18 years old or an institution/organisation online through the National Trust website-www.thenationaltrust.in.

The role of guardian is very important as a person who is appointed to look after a PWD or his/her property. It assumes the care and protection of the person for whom he/she is appointed the guardian. The guardian takes all legal decisions on behalf of the person and the property of the ward. PWD is eligible to open a bank account which will be operated by the guardian.

Such occasion may arise when a person with disability has to deal with issues related to himself, his interests and his properties and since he/she may not always be able to take appropriate decisions in those respects, it would be in the best interests of the person if he/she is represented by a legal guardian in such matters.

Persons with disability should have an Adhar card, Disability certificate, UDID card issued by a governmental medical authority. Parents jointly or single, siblings, relatives or institute can apply for LG certificate. Other qualifications for legal guardians include possessing Adhar card, Indian citizenship, no criminal background, good financial status etc. Brief rules and regulation are mentioned in the website. Additionally, the person applying for guardianship must prepare a will or create a trust to get clarity on moveable and immoveable property details and also to make provision for personal care and maintenance for the ward.

All applications are received by the District Local Level Committee (LLC) which coordinates with the District Collector. They make home visits and discuss with the person appointing for guardianship and understand his/her interest, cross-check all processes and finally issue certificate of Legal Guardian. Additional this, LLC will also make follow up home visits or phone calls to ensure LG is taking good care of trainee or whether not taking proper care. If they have doubts or concerns about the LG, LLC will send notice to LG or cancel the legal guardianship certificate.





